ACTIVE TRAVEL CAPITAL GRANTS

REPORT BY SENIOR STRATEGY OFFICER

This report asks the Partnership to approve allocation of funding from Regional Active Travel Development Fund and the Tactran Active Travel Grant.

1 RECOMMENDATIONS

1.1 That the Partnership:

- (i) approves the allocation of funding from the Regional Active Travel Development Fund 2020/21 to the projects as outlined within the report;
- (ii) approves the allocation of funding from the Tactran Active Travel Grant 2020/21 to the projects as outlined within the report;
- (iii) delegates authority to the Director and Treasurer to agree further projects and award funding for the remainder of the Active Travel Grant Fund 2020/21; and
- (iv) notes the submission of a monitoring proposal to Sustrans Spaces for People Fund.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Tactran and Sustrans have been working in partnership to promote and deliver active travel projects in the Tactran region through the Active Travel Grant (ATG) scheme since 2014/15. The ATG has been designed to reflect and support Sustrans' Places for Everyone scheme and associated criteria. Funding comes to Tactran from Sustrans.
- 2.2 Since 2018/19 Transport Scotland have made available a Regional Active Travel Development Fund (RATDF) available to the RTPs to progress the regional walking and cycling network.
- 2.3 The Partnership Board of March 2020 approved the criteria for identifying suitable projects for RATDF and ATG funding in 2020/21 (Report RTP/20/15 refers).
- 2.4 In May 2020, the Scottish Government announced the Spaces for People fund to bring forward temporary active travel measures that enable social distancing in the light of Covid-19.

2.5 In 2016 the Partnership commenced the joint funding with Cycling Scotland of a Regional Cycle Training and Development Officer to deliver Cycling Scotland programmes across the Tactran region.

3 DISCUSSION

Regional Active Travel Development Fund (RATDF) 2020/21

- 3.1 A grant offer letter was received from Transport Scotland on 30 April 2020 confirming the award of £133,400 to Tactran.
- 3.2 The criteria for identifying suitable RATDF projects approved by the Partnership in March 2020 is that the RADTF funding will be utilised to either:
 - take forward the recommendations of the 13 active travel audits undertaken at key settlements across Angus, Dundee, Perth & Kinross and Stirling Council areas;
 - develop and implement key routes within the Tactran Regional Walking and Cycling Network (TRWCN);
 - develop and implement access to key regional services within the Tactran Region
- 3.3 Discussions with all four Local Authorities have identified the following projects that will progress the implementation of the Regional Walking & Cycling Network:

3.4 The Partnership is asked to approve the total allocation of £133,400 funding to these three projects.

Tactran Active Travel Grant (ATG) 2020/21

- 3.5 On 23 April 2020 Tactran received confirmation from Sustrans that a minimum of £100,000 is available for the Tactran ATG.
- 3.6 The ATG has been designed to reflect and support Sustrans' Places for Everyone scheme and associated criteria, and in March 2020 the Partnership agreed to focus the ATG on improved access to NHS facilities and access to all tiers of Educational establishments.
- 3.7 Discussions with all four Local Authorities have identified the following projects that meet the ATG criteria:

- 3.8 The Partnership is asked to approve award of grant funding to the above projects.
- 3.9 Tactran Officers will continue to liaise with partners regarding the allocation of the remainder of the fund and the Partnership is asked to delegate authority to the Director and Treasurer to agree further projects and award funding.

Spaces for People

3.10 As part of the response to Covid19, to better enable physical distancing, the Scottish Government announced the £10m Spaces for People fund on 28 April, which has subsequently been increased to £30m, and invited applications. The new infrastructure programme fund for pop-up walking and cycling routes or temporary improvements to existing routes is to be administered by Sustrans.

- 3.11 Each of the four constituent Councils are making bids to Sustrans Spaces for People fund to provide temporary measures that allow safe walking and cycling whilst social distancing. To complement these proposals, Tactran is developing a monitoring proposal in conjunction with the Council officers from all 4 Local Authorities to:
 - Assess impact of temporary active travel infrastructure measures put in place by each Council, including parallel routes;
 - Assess short, medium and long term multi-modal trends in our cities/towns; and
 - Undertake behaviour and attitude monitoring.

Bikeability

- 3.12 The principal task of the Regional Cycle Training and Development Officer is to promote the Bikeability cycle training across Tactran. Whilst the demand for cycling appears to have gone up due to a number of factors during the 'lockdown' as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, it is likely that there will be issues in getting the cycle training programme up and running when restrictions are sufficiently lifted by the Scottish Government. Recognising this:
 - The Regional Cycle Training & Development Officer is working with each local authority co-ordinator to discuss plans and the possibility of reallocation of the funding that supports the bikeability programme (Support Plus Funding)
 - The guidelines, risk assessments and procedures will be specific to those delivering Bikeability. Cycling Scotland are advising local authorities and partner organisations to follow current local, national and NHS guidelines for any activity they plan to carry out. 4 CONSULTATIONS

- 4.1 This report has been prepared in consultation with Sustrans officers.
- 4.2 The Regional Active Travel Development Fund and Tactran Active Travel Grant projects have been developed in consultation with the Sustainable Travel Liaison Group, Transportation Officers Liaison Group, Public Transport Officers Liaison Group and other appropriate stakeholders.

5 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Tactran has been awarded £133,400 from Transport Scotland for the Regional Active Travel Grant Fund in 2020/21.
- 5.2 Sustrans has confirmed a minimum allocation of £100,000 for the Tactran Active Travel Grant scheme in 2020/21.
