Dear Executive Committee,

Angus Council is unable to take forward the Montrose to Brechin Caledonian Railway line feasibility study this financial year. Therefore there is a need to reallocate the £30,000 allocated to this project within the Active Travel Capital Programme.

Following discussions with all 4 Local Authorities and Transport Scotland, 2 projects have been identified that meet the Tactran Active Travel Grant criteria, as follows:

- Dundee City Council Arbroath Road Active Freeway route identification and concept design (£15,000)
- Perth & Kinross Council additional contribution to Pittenzie Road construction of shared-use path from Broich Road to Community Campus in Crieff (£15,000)

It has been confirmed both these projects will be completed this financial year.

I support these projects and ask that the Executive Committee consider and approve the reallocation of the Active Travel Grant, as outlined above.

In order to progress with these projects quickly, given the time in the financial year, I would be grateful if you could confirm via e-mail whether you are in agreement with this reallocation **by Monday 13th February 2023** and unless I hear otherwise by then I shall assume your agreement.
